## *Soviet Policy and the Chinese Communists, 1931-1946*

**CHARLES B. McLANE**

Dr. McLane explores the pattern of Soviet Russian policy toward the Communist movement in China from 1931 to 1946. He gives documented information on the fate of the Chinese Communists, the relations between the USSR and the Nationalist government, and the events of those years that were material to relations between Moscow and Yen-an. Constructed chronologically, the study moves from opposition on the part of the Communists to the Kuomintang, through overtures for a united front, to the Second World War and Moscow's eventual support of Mao Tse-tung's forces. \$5.50

**RALPH TALCOTT FISHER, Jr.**

*A Study of the Congresses of the Komsomol,  
1918-1954*

Professor Fisher's study of the Komsomol, the chief instrument for the indoctrination and control of Soviet youth, traces the development of that organization from 1918 to 1954, using the official reports of the Congresses of the Komsomol. The author emphasizes particularly the pattern of attitudes and behavior which the Soviet regime sought to impose upon youth, ranging from demands for abstract qualities of individual character to demands for specific performance in almost all fields of Soviet life. \$6.75
