Two Cities

PAUL FOSTER, O.P.

This is an important statement from the Catholic viewpoint of the problem of the Church-State relationship. Firstly, the author makes a brief survey of the history of this relationship from the time of the classical Greeks down to the present day, and from this simple and straightforward statement of fact draws one or two tentative conclusions to guide our present thought on this most vexed topic. Father Paul Foster does not attempt to force upon the reader any dramatic resolution of an age-old conflict, but rather seeks to show that we cannot know what we are unless we know what we have been. The book is scholarly in approach but brief and simple in construction, and is written especially with the general reader in mind. 6s. 6d.

For Better For Worse: Three Social Sacraments

FERDINAND VALENTINE, O.P.

This series of letters continues the work of penetrating daily life with the spirit of prayer and virtue in terms of three sacraments which make it possible for laymen to live as Christians in the world. These sacraments are Penance, Eucharist (as the Sacrifice also) and Matrimony. The treatment of the subject matter is simple and practical, while being thoroughly grounded in Christian doctrine. There can be no doubt of the need of this book for those living in the world. There have been many good books on these sacraments published in the last decade, but none deals with the spiritual life in precisely this way, a spiritual life which is an essential part of a Christian social life.

The Golden Man

ANTHONY ROSS, O.P.

This delightful book has been written partly for the entertainment of older children, but also to bring out the ideal contained in *The Golden Legend* of Blessed James of Voragine. By a novel treatment of the lives or incidents from the lives of a number of saints the author builds up 'The Golden Man', the ideal Christian who may be king or commoner, priest or bishop, princess or slave-girl. 7s. 6d.

Eve and the Gryphon

GERALD VANN, O.P.

This is the fourth printing of a book first published in 1946, which was reprinted the following year and published in a second edition in 1952. This by itself is enough to recommend this treatment of four great models of Christian Women living in the world, through which Father Vann stresses that most important point in Christian living, namely, that we each have a 'vocation', a call to do something for God that only we, each one of us individually, can do. 6s. 6d.

This work is a presentation of Christianity to the pagan mind of the second century, the circumstances of which are in many ways comparable with those of the twentieth. Athenagoras was a Platonist philosopher who brought over into Christianity some of his philosophical notions and who helped to form the technical apparatus of Christian theology at a vital stage in its development. After his treatise on Embassy, written for presentation to the Emperor and answering the common calumnies against the Christians, he wrote a defence of the doctrine of the Resurrection of the Body. This is also translated in the present volume. The translation is by J. S. Crehan, S.J. **21s. net.**

Tertullian's treatise against Hermogenes is among the most difficult, but also the most interesting of his works. The editor has especially concentrated his attention on the reconstruction of the doctrine of Hermogenes and on both the Platonic and the specifically Christian elements in that doctrine. Further, special care has been given to the elucidation of Tertullian's line of thought, notable by paraphrases and analyses of the contents of the different chapters. The treatise against Hermogenes indeed deserves to be studied both by students of early Christian thought and of ancient philosophy. **21**s. net.
