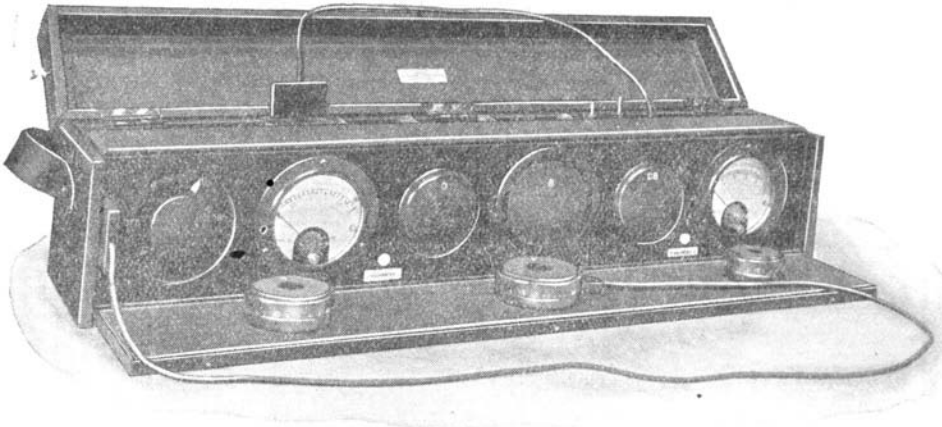
## CLINICAL INSTRUCTION
