OTO-RHINO-LARYNGOLOGY

Applications are invited for the Geoffrey E. Duveen Travelling Studentship for 1949-50, value £650, for research in any aspect of Oto-Rhino-Laryngology (e.g. anatomical, pathological, physical, clinical or physiological).

Candidates must be registered as medical practitioners by the General Medical Council or have had previous education and experience which, in the opinion of the Studentship Board, qualifies them to undertake research in the subject of Oto-Rhino-Laryngology or in any part thereof.

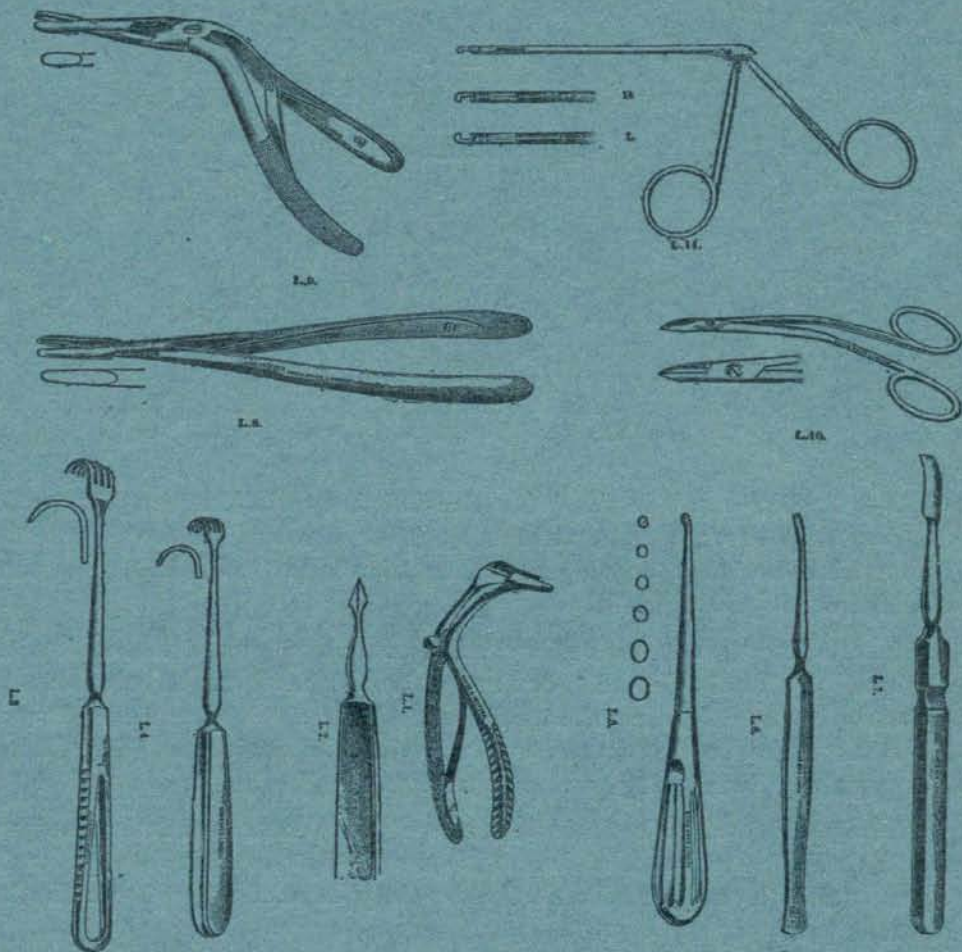
The Studentship is tenable for one year, to be spent in study at home or abroad in accordance with a scheme to be approved by the Studentship Board, but such tenure may be extended for a further year.

Applicants should state their age and qualifications (with dates), the subject of their proposed research (with full details of arrangements proposed for carrying out the work), and the names of two persons to whom reference may be made.

Applications (8 copies) must reach the Academic Registrar, Senate House, University of London, W.C.1, not later than 30th April, 1949.

If the successful applicant is already engaged in postgraduate study at one of the undergraduate or postgraduate teaching hospitals or Medical Schools of the University of London, he will be eligible to apply for a grant from the British Postgraduate Medical Federation in respect of his travelling expenses while holding the Studentship.
