In one of the most important books ever written about the Supreme Court, Raoul Berger argues that the modern Court has corrupted Americans' social lives and subverted the nation's democratic institutions by purposely misreading the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution.

First published by Harvard in 1977, *Government by Judiciary* documents how the Court has acquired virtually unchecked powers by ignoring or actually distorting the Amendment's Equal Protection and Due Process clauses. In pursuit of its own political agenda, the Court—by misusing the Fourteenth Amendment—has “taken over from the people control of their own destiny.”

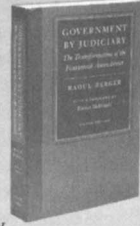
This new second edition includes extensive supplementary discourses in which the author assesses and rebuts the responses of his critics.

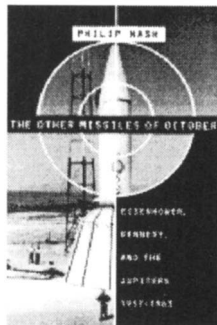

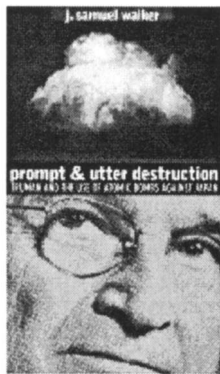
