Politics and Development in Tsinan, Shantung, 1890-1949 David D. Buck

Since the founding of the People's Republic of China, and particularly since 1949, scholars have placed greatest emphasis on the continuing revolution of the rural sector in China. Yet, prior to 1949, it was not the countryside but the city to which most observers, both Chinese and foreign, looked for the beginnings of China's modernization.

In these pages, Buck approaches Chinese urban history through the study of a single major city, Tsinan, the provincial capital of Shantung province. He details the history of Tsinan from the time it was primarily an administrative center in inland China through its subsequent development as a political transportation hub after 1911. He discusses the political, economic, and social life of the city and traces the impact of various changes in each of these sectors.

Lin traces the origins of the concept of cultural revolution, which emerged at the turn of the century and persisted through the Maoist cultural revolutions, found in the antitraditional intellectual radicalism of the May Fourth movement. This uniquely Chinese development, he argues, is largely the result of the powerful influence of a traditional holistic mode of thinking implicitly assumed by the radical intelligentsia in the midst of its explicit complete rejection of the Chinese cultural heritage. In explicating this thesis, he has subtly placed the ideas of Ch'en Tu-hsiu, Hu Shih and Lu Hsun – the three most celebrated leaders of the May Fourth intelligentsia – in the broader historical context of the dialectic of social and intellectual change and continuity in modern China. Lin treats these leading thinkers in great detail, to convey a sense of the intellectual unity as well as diversity of the iconoclastic movement. Fall. 1978 232 pages




