Well being and mental disorder: epidemiological tools in the global village

In the last few years we have learned that social and environmental factors have an essential impact on mental well-being and mental disorders. We are witnessing changing family structures, new gender roles, increased population and social mobility and a variety of other societal changes. Culture and environment have an important influence on patterns of mental disorders, and psychiatric epidemiology is the key discipline for analysing these developments. Psychosocial risk factors and biological markers as well as their interdependence are essential to understanding the aetiology of mental disorders. The 12th International Congress of IFPE will be a major opportunity for researchers and clinicians engaged with these issues to report their findings and exchange their ideas. Leading experts in their field will report as well as younger researchers who are at the beginning of their careers. Apart from the main theme of the Congress, research reports from all other aspects of psychiatric epidemiology, including service planning and service evaluation, pharmaco-epidemiology and clinical epidemiology are very welcome.

IFPE will offer some support to participants from low-income countries, trainees, and graduate students.
