Rich with visuals, Judith Barringer's new text, *The Art and Archaeology of Ancient Greece*, is a telling examination of how objects were meant to be perceived, what "messages" they transmitted, and how the surrounding environment shaped their meaning. Barringer masterfully weaves text and images for a lively narrative of the function and context of artifacts from the Bronze Age through Roman Greece, recounting changes in interests, motivations, and appearance of the visual output of Greek culture over time within a framework that includes both historical and archeological perspectives. The chronological organization helps students grasp the bigger concepts of the age, while the thematic organization within the chapters facilitates an understanding of the major developments and changes within periods.

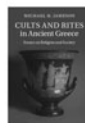
