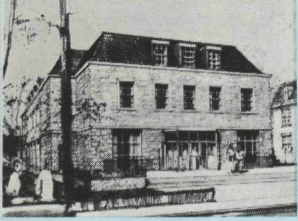

For more than half a century, the finest products of Canadian scholarship have been issued by one of North America's great universities over the imprint of the University of Toronto Press. Within the past decade, the tide has risen rapidly, until today this university press publishes 100 new titles annually—more than any other Canadian house.

These publications represent the fruits of research and the flowering of creative talent at Canadian centres of learning from coast to coast. When these books were published, profit from sales was the least consideration. Some of them have indeed become famous best-sellers; others have more than paid their cost of publication; but many—and among them some of the most important—have been liberally subsidized by the Press as well as by assisting agencies such as the Social Science Research Council of Canada, the Humanities Research Council, and the Canada Council. All of the volumes have been edited, designed, and printed with the greatest care so that in both content and appearance they now stand with pride on the bookshelves of the world.

These works have long been the treasured tools of scholars, librarians, authors, and research students, for they are, many of them, the seminal books from which other books have been and will be written. But even though the Press has often subsidized their publication costs in order that they might be sold for prices that were less than cost, they have not been cheap.

Now, new methods of quantity production and distribution have made it possible to begin the re-issue of these key works in paperback editions selling at a fraction of the original price, yet just as handsomely printed and illustrated. C U P Books are firmly sewn and can be read and re-read without falling apart; the paper covers are attractively printed in colours and laminated with plastic for extra durability and appearance.

Included in the series are titles as diverse as the branches of study which have produced them. Among the first eight titles are both specialized works and others less specialized but written by scholars out of their wide background of scholarship for the pleasure and profit of all.

Now, for a few dollars, every serious reader, every teacher, every undergraduate and graduate student can have continuing access to these works of basic Canadian scholarship himself, and in editions he will be proud to own. Now, at last, every serious reader can have the product of Canadian scholarship within reach of his hand at all times.



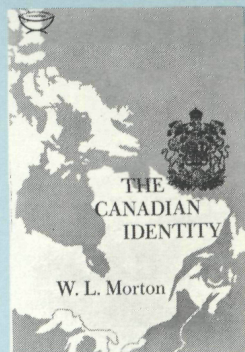
