## THE CONTRIBUTORS

ABRAM BERGSON is Frank W. Taussig Research Professor of Economics at Harvard University. Among his more recent books are *Essays in Normative Economics* (1966) and *Planning and Productivity under Soviet Socialism* (1968). He is at present working on a quantitative appraisal of socialist economic performance.

DAVID E. POWELL is Assistant Professor at the Woodrow Wilson Department of Government and Foreign Affairs of the University of Virginia. He is currently engaged in a study of the social costs of modernization in the USSR.

MICHAEL J. BRENNER is Assistant Professor in the Department of Government at Cornell University. At present he is engaged in a study of the conceptual bases of United States foreign policy making.

MYRON WEINER is Professor of Political Science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He is the author of *Party Building in a New Nation: The Indian National Congress* (1967), editor of *State Politics in India* (1968), and co-author of the forthcoming *Crises and Sequences of Political Development*.
