

some chapters are printed on matt and others on glossy paper.

Of particular interest are the chapter by Hutton on the Significance and Relationship of Eye Movements in Alzheimer's Disease to Visuospatial Confusion; the Clinical Description of Methods of Non-Verbal Communication Abilities by Demented Patients When Language Fails, by Hoffman and colleagues of Binghamton; the Discussion of Brain-behaviour Relationships in Amnesic and Dementing Illnesses by Sagar (Sheffield, U.K.), including Anatomical and Neurochemical Correlates Both in Alzheimer's and Parkinson's Disease; and a chapter on the Intracerebral Transplantation of Cholinergic Neurons in a New Rat Model of Alzheimer's Disease, by Arendash and colleagues (Tampa).

The last two contributions are of special importance. Khachaturian, of the National Institute on Aging, reminds the reader of the dramatic demographic changes in the aging North

American population, and offers a succinct review of future areas for biomedical hypotheses which offer greater promise at the present state of knowledge. Haber, of the Veterans' Administration Medical Center, Palo Alto, concludes with a thorough review of the extensive involvement of the Veterans' Administration in the treatment of such patients, as well as burgeoning new programs of research which the V.A. is currently stimulating.

Like other hard-cover texts, this volume suffers from the fact that it appears in print some three years after the original Conference, but those neuroscientists keeping abreast of the Alzheimer literature may well wish to add this volume to their libraries.
