A rich new source of materials for the history of the momentous period culminating in the Great War of 1914-1918 will be made available, under the editorship of two distinguished authorities on modern diplomatic history, during the next three or four years, by the publication of selections from the Archives of the Foreign Office.

Commencing with the year 1898 the story will be unfolded in eleven volumes packed with documents of the highest importance, very few of which, except in the last volume, have ever been published before.

The publication of such recent documents on such a scale as this is unprecedented in this country and the series will unquestionably stand out as by far the most important contribution to the study of contemporary history that has been made within recent memory in Great Britain.

It has been decided to publish Volume XI first. This volume deals with the period 28 June to 4 August, 1914. This has not been prepared by the Editors but by Mr J. W. Headlam-Morley, C.B.E., and will be ready shortly.
