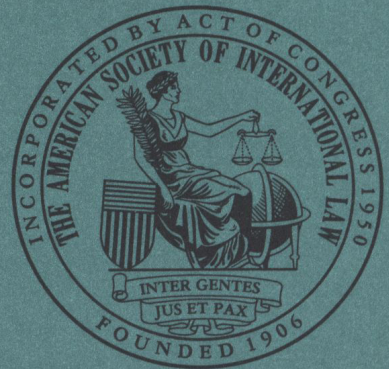

In 1990 Iran and the United States agreed to settle the remaining small claims, those under \$250,000, pending at the Iran–United States Claims Tribunal. These cases were referred to the U.S. Foreign Claims Settlement Commission, which was charged with applying Tribunal precedent. This article examines those decisions and concludes that, while the Commission was generally faithful to its mandate, it missed some opportunities to enhance the clarity of the international law of state responsibility and diplomatic protection.
