In Memoriam

The editors report with sorrow the death of Professor Neil L. Wilson in Vancouver on September 5, 1983. Dr. Wilson received his Ph.D. from Yale University in 1951. He taught at the University of Western Ontario from 1951-1952, Bishop's University from 1952-1957, Duke University from 1957-1960 and 1961-1969, Visiting Professor at Harvard University in 1960-1961, and McMaster University from 1969-1983. Professor Wilson was the author of *The Concept of Language* (Toronto: University of Toronto Press, 1959) and numerous articles in the philosophy of language, logic, and the philosophy of mathematics. The Philosophy Department at McMaster University has honoured Professor Wilson by naming the Department library "The N. L. Wilson Library". Professor Wilson was a member of the Canadian Philosophical Association, and served on the Executive Board of the C.P.A., as well as on the Board of Referees for *Dialogue*.
