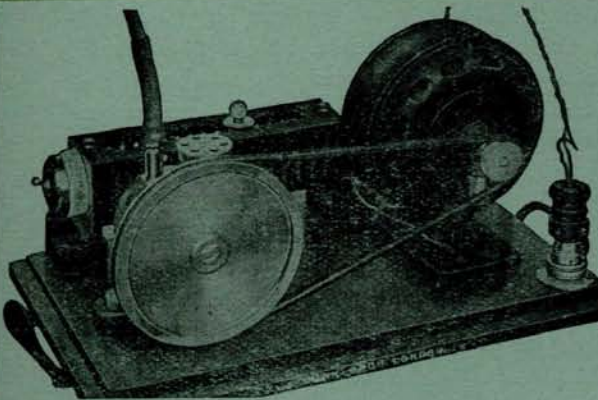

 of Ether.**

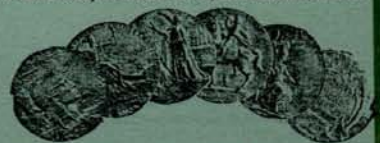

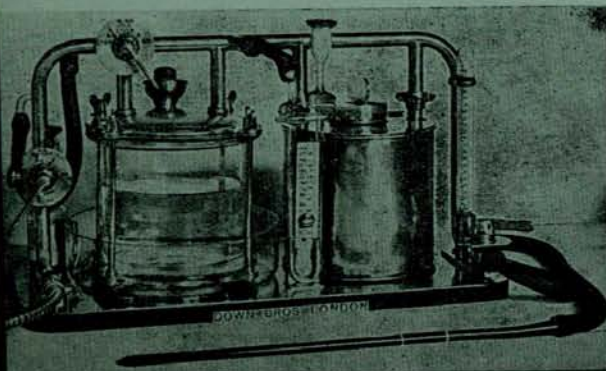
