## CONTRIBUTORS

A. M. HALPERN, a former Senior Staff Member of The RAND Corporation concerned with contemporary Far Eastern affairs, is at present a Research Fellow of the China project of the Council on Foreign Relations. He is working on a book-length study of Chinese Communist foreign policy, with special emphasis on Chinese relations with Japan and with neutralist countries and movements.

WILLIAM T. SHINN, JR., is a Foreign Service Officer, presently serving as Second Secretary and Vice-Consul at the American Embassy in Warsaw. He received an M.A. degree in Regional Studies—Soviet Union at Harvard University and spent a year in Moscow as a graduate student in 1959-1960.

THORNTON READ, Research Associate of the Center of International Studies at Princeton University, served as co-editor, with Klaus Knorr, of *Limited Strategic War* (1962).

CURT F. BECK, Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Connecticut, contributed several chapters to *Czechoslovakia*, edited by V. Bušek (1957). He is engaged in a study of the Soviet Union and the emergence of blocs in Africa.

THOMAS C. SCHELLING is Professor of Economics at Harvard University and a faculty member of Harvard's Center for International Affairs. His publications include *The Strategy of Conflict* (1960) and, with Morton H. Halperin, *Strategy and Arms Control* (1961).

RICHARD BUTWELL, Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Illinois, is the author of *Southeast Asia Today and Tomorrow: A Political Analysis* (1961) and a forthcoming volume, *U Nu: A Political Biography*. He taught at the University of Rangoon in 1959-1960 and revisited Burma in 1962.

LEONARD BUSHKOFF, a graduate student in history at the University of Chicago, is currently in Washington, completing a thesis on the Comintern and Macedonian nationalism during the mid-1920's.
