This is the first volume to be published in the new *Library of International Studies*.

The book deals with the history of ideas associated with Marxist movements. These ideas, which so agitated the young Communist revisionists, are traced and analysed against their historical and contemporary background. Theoreticians who played the most important role in re-examining or modifying their assumptions are re-assessed from the perspective of the second half of the twentieth century, among them Eduard Bernstein and Rosa Luxemburg, Leon Trotsky and Nikolai Bukharin, Georg Lukacs and Ernst Bloch. The significance of revisionism, its prospects inside the Communist bloc, and its impact on the 'New Left' outside it, are analysed by scholars of international repute, each dealing with his special subject.

The symposium also provides material on the Soviet attitude to revisionism and gives the necessary background for the understanding of the evolution of Communist ideology.
