### SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Inter-University Committee on Travel Grants will again have fellowships available for advanced graduate students and faculty members to study in Czechoslovakia and Hungary in 1967-68. Periods of study ranging from one semester to one calendar year can be arranged. The deadline

for application for periods beginning in February, 1967, is June 1, 1966. Interested persons should get in touch with Howard Mehlinger, Deputy Chairman, Inter-University Committee on Travel Grants, Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana 47405.

The Austrian Ministry of Education will again grant a limited number of scholarships for the academic year 1967-68. One or more of these scholarships can be awarded to an American student now working on a doctoral dissertation or on another research project which deals with the nationality problems of the Habsburg monarchy. These scholarships have a monthly stipend of 2,600 schilling. They are not to be used to supplement a stipend received from another scholarship or fellowship. Holders of these scholarships are expected to be in residence in an Austrian university. While married students who have adequate financial resources are not excluded from consideration, preference will be given to unmarried pre-doctoral students who will have passed their preliminary examinations before June, 1967. Persons wishing to apply for this scholarship should send a letter of application, together with letters of recommendation and other supporting material, directly to R. John Rath, Department of History and Political Science, Rice University, Houston, Texas 77001, *before December 15, 1966.*
