I am a Spectacled Bear (*Tremarctos ornatus*), an Endangered Species, and one of my few remaining habitats is an area of Bolivia which has just been decreed the National Park of Amboró.

Much of Amboró is tropical and subtropical rain forest which is one of the world's most valuable and most threatened habitats.

The Bolivian Wildlife Society is trying to save me and other Endangered Species, and our habitat by, amongst other projects, activating Amboró, in which task they will be helped by Expedition 3A of Operation Raleigh from July to September—but they could do with your help as well!

The National Park of Amboró is close to the city of Santa Cruz, which is the centre of the illegal trade in wildlife, and when activated will do much to create public awareness of the need to protect their wildlife heritage.
