

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Harvey began as a tropical storm but later intensified as it reached the Texas coast where it rained for four days causing catastrophic flooding. Irma reached category 5 and made seven landfalls. Widespread devastation followed. It is one of the costliest and strongest hurricanes on record. Maria began as a category 5 hurricane, first hit the island of Dominica, and later devastated Puerto Rico. Maria is the third costliest hurricane in US history. Jose reached category 4 but bypassed the islands of the Caribbean, which were recovering from Irma.

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Due to the intensity surrounding the serial hurricanes, coverage may extend beyond one issue.

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
