SECOND CONFERENCE OF THE BRITISH SOCIETY OF AUDIOLOGY

THIS Conference will be held at the University of Southampton from 16 to 18 July 1975 in the Medical and Biological Sciences Building of the newly-established Medical School. The introductory lecture will be given by Professor W. Burns of Charing Cross Hospital, London, entitled "Aspects of the peripheral auditory mechanism".

Papers on the following topics by persons experienced in the field will also be given. Noise-induced hearing loss, electrophysiological techniques, paedo-audiology, diagnostic techniques in testing children (round table), neuro-otology, aids to hearing. In addition there will be associated films, scientific and commercial exhibitions, and social and ladies' programmes.

THE GOULD AWARD

THE William and Harriet Gould Foundation announces the recipient of the 1973 Gould Award: Dr. Masayuki Sawashima, Professor of Speech Physiology at the Research Institute of Logopedics and Phoniatics at the University of Tokyo, Japan. Professor Sawashima was honored for his basic contributions to laryngeal physiology.

The Gould Award is presented annually for outstanding fundamental contributions in the field of laryngology. The recipient is selected by an International Committee which at present consists of Professeur Dr. Bernard Vallancien, 16 Rue Spontini, Paris XVI^e, France; Dr. John A. Kirchner, Yale University School of Medicine, Section of Otolaryngology, 333 Cedar Street, New Haven, Connecticut, 16510; Professor Toshio Shiroya, M.D., Tokyo Medical College, Department of Otolaryngology, 6 Nishi-Shinjuku, Tokyo, 160, Japan; and Dr. Hans von Leden, Institute of Laryngology and Voice Disorders, 10921 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, Chairman.

The Award consists of an illuminated plaque and a cash prize. Nominations for the Gould Award should be filed with one of the Committee members as soon as possible.
