The climax of French empire-building has never before been fully analyzed, and it makes a remarkable story. Governments tend to lose control of their soldiers and officials at the outposts of empire, but the authors show that the French government lost control of imperial policy even in its own capital. A small band of enthusiasts, in and out of government, largely determined policies and actions regarding the overseas empire, and they are shown to have been motivated less by considerations of strategy and trade than by the myth of France's civilizing mission. \$29.50
