## THE CONTRIBUTORS

JOHN H. HERZ is Associate Professor of Government at the City College of New York. Among his publications are *Political Realism and Political Idealism* (1951) and, with G. M. Carter, *Major Foreign Powers* (1957).

ARTHUR LEE BURNS is a Research Fellow of the Department of International Relations in the Australian National University at Canberra, A.C.T. His current subjects of research include the methodology of social sciences and history, the relations between ideological movements and military alliances, and disarmament.

DANKWART A. RUSTOW is Associate Professor of Politics and Research Associate of the Center of International Studies at Princeton University, where he specializes in Near Eastern politics. He is the author of *The Politics of Compromise: A Study of Parties and Cabinet Government in Sweden* (1955).

ROBERT C. TUCKER, Consultant in the Social Science Division of The RAND Corporation, was formerly Attaché of the American Embassy in Moscow and Editor of the Anglo-American Joint Press Reading Service there. The politics and psychology of totalitarianism constitute his special field of research interest.

RAYMOND VERNON is Director of the New York Metropolitan Region Study and former Acting Director of the Office of Economic Defense and Trade Policy of the Department of State. He is the author of *Organizing for World Trade* (1955) and a forthcoming Senate Committee report, *The International Patent System and Foreign Policy*.

JAMES S. COLEMAN, Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of California (Los Angeles), has published a number of articles dealing with African problems and is at present engaged in a comparative study of political developments in Central and East Africa.

RICHARD D. CHALLENGER is Assistant Professor of History at Princeton University. The author of *The French Theory of the Nation in Arms* (1955), he is preparing a study of military-diplomatic relations in the United States at the beginning of the twentieth century.

MARVER H. BERNSTEIN, Associate Professor of Politics at Princeton University, is the author of *Regulating Business by Independent Commission* (1955) and a forthcoming book, *The Politics of Israel*. He is spending the summer of 1957 in Israel, studying local political developments.
