*Lepralia punctata* Hassall, 1841 (Bryozoa, Cheilostomata)

*Taeniolabis* Cope, 1882 (Mammalia, Multituberculata).

Recent Opinions published in the same issue of the *Bulletin* included the following:

Opinion 1409 (p. 247).—*Adianthus bucatatus* Ameghino, 1891 (Mammalia): neotype designated.
