Providing travel assistance for young WPSA members and students to participate in regional and global WPSA conferences

The Association has funds set aside for a limited number of travel grants. These are to provide international travel assistance for young WPSA members (both scientists and poultry producers) from developing countries and students from developed countries to

attend and participate in regional and global WPSA conferences.

WPSA Travel Grant programme for older scientists (>40 yrs) from developing countries

For many years, the WPSA Board has supported a travel grant programme for members 40 years of age and younger, to enable them to attend international WPSA-sponsored meetings in other countries. Application for these grants is open to WPSA members from both developing and developed countries. It is recognised that older scientists from developing countries, even those in relatively senior positions, frequently have considerable difficulty in finding funds to attend international meetings. It is even more difficult for scientists in this age group who have only recently obtained a higher degree. Because of the lack of available training opportunities, many scientists in developing countries are near to 40 by the time they obtain a higher degree and be in a position to present their work at international meetings. The value of interaction with other scientists with similar interests and expertise, is well recognised.

It is for these reasons that WPSA has instituted a new travel grant programme to assist older (>40 years) WPSA members from developing countries to attend and present a paper (oral or poster) at international meetings. The programme is designed to

provide some financial assistance, NOT to cover the entire costs of the travel to and attendance at the meeting in question. As a not-for-profit organisation, WPSA has limited funds to allocate towards the programme, which means that the number of grants and the size of the individual grants, will not be great. Successful applicants are encouraged to use the grant as leverage in application for additional funding from the applicant's institution or other bodies. The programme is competitive and applicants are required to provide information about their research, and current status and about their planned contribution to the meeting in question, as described below and on the application form. Successful applicants will be expected to provide on their return, a brief report on the meeting and on the benefits derived by their attendance.

All applications will be assessed by a travel grants assessment committee set up under the WPSA Board. The committee will make its recommendations to the Secretary, who will advise the applicants in due course. WPSA Speakers Bureau Fostering local and regional conferences in the poultry sciences

During the 34th meeting of the Board of WPSA on August 20, 2000 in Montreal, Canada it was recognised that expertise in several areas of poultry science and production in low income countries is often very limited, and WPSA branches in these countries often do not have sufficient financial resources to fund overseas speakers.

To address this problem, the Board created a Speakers' Bureau to assist branches in low income countries to cover the travel costs of expert international speakers. This measure is consistent with the key objective of WPSA to encourage and facilitate liaison among research scientists and educators, and between those in research and education and those working in the many diverse sectors of the poultry industry. Under the Speakers' Bureau scheme, WPSA will pay only the cost of air travel (lowest economy class). All other expenses such as local travel and accommodation are to be paid by the organizing Branch(es). WPSA will not pay any honorarium to speakers.

Given the high cost of international air travel it is important that optimum value be obtained from this expenditure by WPSA. This can be achieved by insisting that the visiting speaker provides more than just one paper at a conference. The visiting speaker could contribute in a variety of ways, e.g., present a second paper on a related topic, conduct a workshop for graduate students, have small group or one-on-one interaction, especially with students, visit industry groups, visit university groups, etc.

Unless the Branch (or group of Branches) can pay all the speakers' costs itself, a speaker should NOT be invited until approval of Speakers' Bureau funds is made by the WPSA Executive Committee. The Branch(es) should not assume that approval will be given until so advised by the WPSA Secretary.

Where a Branch or a group of Branches wish to apply for Speakers Bureau assistance, there are certain conditions which must be met:

Application conditions

Application must be made using the WPSA Speakers' Bureau application form.

Application must be submitted at least 2 months prior to the meeting.

The speaker must contribute more to the meeting and/or branch than just presenting one paper.

Following approval, the speaker or the local Branch will be reimbursed by the WPSA Treasurer after the meeting.

A maximum of 2 speakers will be sponsored from the Speakers' Bureau per meeting.

The Branch(es) must be up-to-date with their membership payment.

Foundation for Promoting Poultry Science Stichting Bevordering Pluimveewetenschappen

The XIX World's Poultry Congress, held in September 1992 in Amsterdam, was financially successful. This outcome was, to a large extent, due to the contributions received from the 16 main sponsors and over 2500 participants. The terms of reference of the Congress Organizing Foundation required that any credit balance that

resulted after all liabilities had been met should be made available to the Dutch Branch of WPSA as initiator of the organization of the Congress. As a result, a Foundation for Promoting Poultry Science (Stichting Bevordering Pluimveewetenschappen) was founded. The general objective of this foundation are "to

promote the developments and propagation of poultry science in WPSA-structures, and specifically:

1. the stimulation of international congresses and the promotion of participation in these events, and
2. the support of initiative having the objective of establishing WPSA-branches in countries which do not yet have them”.

Individuals and organizations may apply for financial support for appropriate WPSA activities such as conferences, congresses and symposia. Applications for financial support of conferences, congresses and symposia should be forwarded through the local WPSA Branch.

The Foundation has a particular interest in assisting in the process of establishing new WPSA branches and therefore supports these branches by covering for three years part of

the membership fees. Individuals and organizations may apply for financial support by contacting Ir H. Hupkes, Odijkerweg 37, NL-3972 NE Driebergen, The Netherlands, e-mail: h.hupkes@zonnet.nl. An application form will be send on request.

The Board of directors of the Foundation meets three or four times a year. In case of requests for financial assistance to attend conferences, congresses and symposia, applications should be received by the secretary at least 3 months before the meeting.

Application forms should be filled out completely and can be send through e-mail and fax. An original application form should be send by regular mail.

It is the Boards policy not to fund individual applicants more than 2 times.

WPSA Scholarship Awards 2016

The Foundation for Promoting Poultry Science of the Netherlands Branch of the World's Poultry Science Association has announced that the sixth group of awards will be presented at the XXV World's Poultry Congress during September 5-9, 2016 in Beijing, China. The awards will be made in two categories – Education and Research – in conjunction with the mission of the WPSA logo. An internationally representative committee chosen by the Board of the Foundation will decide the recipients. While it is anticipated that one award will be made in each category, this may vary depending on the number and quality of submissions.

WPSA Research Award

A WPSA Research Award will be presented at the XXV World's Poultry Congress to an outstanding scientist in recognition of research achievement related to the poultry industry. Only those who have been members of the World's Poultry Science Association for at least two years immediately preceding the Congress will be eligible. The award will consist of a certificate or plaque and €11,000 (currently about US\$12,000).

The award will be made to a scientist who has made an outstanding contribution in his or her field and based on up to five publications in refereed journals. The papers need not all relate to the same research project but they must be in the same general area. The scientist must be the senior author in the case of papers with multiple authors.

Nominations for the award may only be made by a WPSA member. Offprints or copies of the papers (up to five) on which it is based should accompany the nomination (other relevant papers may be cited). The nomination document, which should not exceed 1000 words, should include:

- reasons for making the nomination;
- a brief biography of the scientist being nominated;
- plans for the utilization of that part of the award not given directly to the recipient.

These plans must be in sufficient detail to enable the awards Committee to assess the nature and value of the research programme. Examples of eligible costs include the

purchase of leasing of equipment and stipends for graduate students.

WPSA Education Award

A WPSA Education Award will be presented at the XXV World's Poultry Congress to an individual or group who, in the view of the Awards Committee, have made a major contribution to poultry management education in a five year period immediately preceding the congress. Nominees (or leaders of groups in the case of joint nominations) must have been members of the World's Poultry Science Association for at least two years immediately preceding the Congress at which the award is made. The award will consist of a certificate or plaque and €11,000 (currently about US\$12,000).

Education will be interpreted liberally with achievement being represented by books, other publications, films, videos or the development of training programmes for poultry scientists, managers or workers. Nominations for the award may only be made by a WPSA member and should consist of:

- a description of the work, summarised in not more than 1000 words, which should give details of the educational project (including information on the target group or groups);
- a brief biography of the individual or group (maximum one page of A4)
- an assessment of how much impact has been achieved;
- a clear indication of how the balance of the award would be applied to future educational activities. Examples might include publications, extension of courses, revision of videos etc., or entirely new initiatives.

The nominating document may be supported by additional items in the form of written or other work by the nominee/nominee group, but the nomination itself must be sufficient to stand-alone for evaluation by the Awards committee.

Nominations

Nominations should be submitted to the WPSA Awards Committee at least six months before the start of the 2016 World's Poultry Congress. The deadline for receipt of submissions will be

Those nominated must, if successful, undertake to present a report of their work at the next World's Poultry Congress following the one at which the award was made.

Successful cooperation between two WPSA branches: Russia and Turkey

The 'Potential for Poultry Production in Developing Countries Congress' was jointly organised by two branches and run in Antalya, Turkey from 15-18 October 2015.

The harmonious cooperation between the WPSA Russian and Turkish branches led to the success of the meeting. The theme of the congress was the untapped potential of poultry production in many developing countries, which is crucial to expanding food production and availability.



The Honorary Past President of the WPSA, Professor Rveyde Akbay attended the XVIII International Scientific Poultry Conference, organised on May 2015 by the Russian Branch of the WPSA in Sergiev Possad near Moscow. In her presentation Prof. Akbay expressed a proposal to gather a scientific meeting in Antalya, Turkey, to give a possibility for poultry scientists from various, mainly developing, countries to get together, share the latest scientific information and discuss actual problems in poultry sector. Prof. Akbay suggested organising this event through the joint effort of the Turkish and Russian Branches of the WPSA. This idea was accepted by the Russian Branch Co-chairs of the organising committee were Professors Rveyde Akbay (Turkey) and Vladimir Fisinin (President of the Russian branch of WPSA). The scientific committee was headed by Professor Servet Yalcin (Ege University, Turkey) and Professor Ivan Egorov (VNITIP, Russia). The members of the organising committee were responsible for the venue of PDC-2015, setting up the programme, inviting of the participants and obtaining sponsors. The scientific committee prepared an interesting and diverse scientific programme, invited key speakers for plenary

and section sessions, collected and selected papers and published the proceedings. The PDC-2015 was deemed a successful and productive scientific forum, attended by 292 participants from 27 countries, representing Asia, Europe, Africa and America. There were 113 scientific works presented, among them 16 from invited speakers, 21 oral presentations and 76 poster presentations. At the opening ceremony on October 15th Professor Rveyde Akbay welcomed the participants and explained the goals of the event- the joint efforts of poultry scientists for better development of poultry production. The President of WPSA Dr. Edir Silva (Brazil) emphasised the role of the WPSA in the progress of poultry science and industry on a global level. Professor Vladimir Fisinin discussed current challenges and goals in poultry science, the history of the Russian branch of the WPSA, its activity and the main areas of research and development. Indonesia

On November 18, 2015, The WPSA-Indonesian Branch organised a symposium on 'Use of feed additives for reducing cost of production and feed formulation in poultry.' The symposium was held in the ICT Center, University of Diponegoro, Semarang, Central Java. The Keynote presentation was given by Dr. J.F. Huang from WPSA-Taiwan, and was sponsored by the Speaker's Bureau of WPSA. Other scientific presentations were given by the following speakers: Dr. V. Ravindran, DSM Nutritional Products International Inc. 'Feed Additives: Past, Present, and Future'; Rodel Cueno, M.Sc., Novus International Inc. 'Cutting Cost Through Increasing Protein Digestibility'; Dr. Alex Wu, Adisseo Asia Pacific Pte Ltd. 'Using Liquid Source of Methionine to Reduce Costs of Feed Formulation and Processing'; Dr. Neil Gannon, Biomin Asia Pacific Pte Ltd. 'Strategic Application and Combination of Feed Additives Maximises Feed Efficiency in Poultry' and David Zhu, Ph.D., Trouw Nutrition Asia Pacific Pte Ltd. 'Maximise Anti-Oxidant Status to Manage Oxidative Stress for Poultry'.

The event was sponsored by national feed milling companies, international pharmaceutical and feed additive companies, and was attended by about 100 people consisting of nutritionists and feed formulators, animal scientists, home-mix farmers, feed suppliers, members of WPSA-Indonesia, lecturers and students. The symposium was organised in conjunction with the '5th National Seminar on Local Poultry Developments', by the Faculty of Animal

Husbandry, University of Diponegoro. In this seminar, Dr. J.F. Huang shared information on the development of the local duck industry in Taiwan.

The symposium was followed by the 4th Congress of WPSA-Indonesia, in which new officers were elected to continue the excellent work of the officers from 2003-2015 periods. Dr. J.F. Huang gave some opening remarks for the Congress. During the Congress, Professor Dr. Dwi Sunarti, from University of Diponegoro, was unanimously elected as the new President of WPSA-Indonesia for the next five years. She was given a month to establish her new team.

Japan

The 2015 Autumn Meeting of the Japan Poultry Science Association (JPSA) was held at Rakuno Gakuen University in Hokkaido during 9-10 September. The meeting included a total of 49 paper presentations, an open symposium, as well as council and general meetings. A total of 141 participants attended the meeting.

The open symposium entitled 'Current status and issues on animal welfare for meat-type chicken production' contained four keynote addresses and a panel discussion. Over 80 people attended the symposium. The discussions were lively with an active exchange of opinions about animal welfare issues for broiler chickens.

During the Autumn Business Meeting, the JPSA Award was presented to Dr. Tomohiro Sasanami, Shizuoka University; and, the JPSA Encouragement Prize was presented to Dr. Tatsuhiro Goto, Ibaraki University, for their brilliant research achievements. The research topics of Dr. Sasanami and Dr. Goto were as follows: 'Studies on the molecular mechanism of avian fertilisation,' and the 'Identification of quantitative trait loci for egg-related traits in chickens', respectively.

In addition, Kiichi Minami (Kobe University), Shoko Namekawa (Ibaraki University), Tatsuya Koyama (Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology), and Mana Kawaguchi (Kagoshima University) received excellent presentation awards in the category of 'students' or 'members aged 30 and below' for the following presentations:

'Exhaustive gene expression profiling analysis on the asymmetric morphogenesis of embryonic chicken gonad'; 'Interaction of STAT3 and STAT5 in the leptin signal transduction'; 'Effects of leucine and isoleucine supplementation on myogenesis in broilers'; and the 'Effects of delayed feed intake on growth performance and intestinal flora in broiler chicks', respectively.

The 2016 Spring Meeting of JPSA will be held on March 30 at the Nippon Veterinary and Life Science University in Musashino, Tokyo.

The afternoon session was devoted to paper presentations by local poultry experts and young scientists. Seven papers were presented during that session.

The Annual General Meeting of the Sri Lankan Branch was held during the evening of the same day, followed by an Awards Presentation Ceremony and a cocktail party. For the awards ceremony, The guest speaker was Mr. S. Thiyagarajah, CEO, NDB Bank, Sri Lanka.
