




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Cornflower (*Centaurea cyanus* L.) is an annual member of the plant family Asteraceae, native to the Mediterranean region. Probably introduced as an ornamental, cornflower is also known as bachelor's button, and is often included in wildflower seed mixes. This photograph depicts some of the variation in petal color characteristics in this species, ranging from nearly white to lavender or blue, to deep rose or purple.
