CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

J. H. Hexter is Charles J. Stillé Professor of History at Yale University and serves as director of the Yale Parliamentary Diaries Project. He is the author of *The Reign of King Pym* and of *Reappraisals in History*. Included in his other extensive scholarly activities is a previous article published in the *Journal of British Studies*.

Ira Klein, who is Assistant Professor of History at the American University, has published several articles on Asian studies.

Charles F. Mullett, Professor of History at the University of Missouri, is the author of *The Bubonic Plague and England* and of *Fundamental Law and the American Revolution*. Included in his other extensive scholarly activities is a previous article published in the *Journal of British Studies*. He is chairman of the American Section of the Joint A.H.A.-C.H.A. Committee.

Barbee-Sue Mansfield Rodman is Assistant Professor of History at Claremont Men's College. She has previously published an article on Bentham.

Lawrence Stone, Professor of History and chairman of the department at Princeton University, was a leading participant in the Tawney—Trevor-Roper controversy before he published *The Crisis of the Aristocracy, 1558-1641*. He retains his residence in Oxford, England.

David Underdown, author of *Royalist Conspiracy in England 1649-1660*, has recently moved from the University of Virginia to a professorship at Brown University. He has published articles on the seventeenth century in addition to an earlier one in the *Journal of British Studies*.

Barbara MacDonald Walker has this year been appointed Assistant Professor of History at Occidental College. She is completing her work for the Ph.D. degree at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

Stephen R. Ward, Assistant Professor of History at the University of South Dakota, is here publishing his first article.
