JAPANESE CULTURE AND BEHAVIOR: Selected Readings. Edited by Takie Sugiyama Lebra and William P. Lebra. 470 pages, paper \$5.95. While stressing the complexity, conflict, and dynamism inherent in Japanese culture, the 23 articles fit together so that Japanese culture as manifested in behavior will emerge as a coherent system in the reader's mind.
