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Journal of Helminthology provides an international vehicle for the publication of original papers and review articles on all aspects of pure and applied helminthology, particularly those helminth parasites of environmental health, medical or veterinary importance. Research papers on helminths in wildlife hosts including plant and insect parasites will also be welcome. Taxonomic contributions will be acceptable if they contribute to the systematics of a group and particularly if they employ biochemical or molecular biological techniques.

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The authors must demonstrate the experimental procedures employed conform to the accepted principles of animal welfare in experimental science. The principles defined and explained in the European Convention for the Protection of Vertebrate Animals used for Experimental and Other Scientific Purposes and its appendix and/or the National Research Council Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals should be followed. If experimental methodology raises particular ethical or welfare concerns then the Editor will take additional guidance from Animals (Scientific Procedures) Act 1986, when making decisions. The Editor's decision with regard to ethics will be final.

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
