The *British International Law Cases* make available to persons working in international law, or government, or carrying out research, full reports hitherto denied to those without the most complete libraries. The *Cases* will become an indispensable tool, essential as a new source of authorities and references selected after critical examination of their relevance to contemporary needs.

Following a classification by topic throughout, the first volumes of *British International Law Cases* will cover the Law of Peace, excluding prize and private international law cases as such, as applied by Courts and Tribunals in the British Isles. Later volumes will deal with War and Neutrality. Decisions of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on appeal from Courts overseas are included, as well as decisions of the Irish Courts.

Every effort has been made to make the collection as comprehensive as possible, to gather together all the important British decisions, and to make these freely available. *British International Law Cases* will simplify research and will enable every practitioner, law library, and department of international law to acquire their own reports of the many British cases dealt with, at comparatively little cost.

The *Cases* not only antedate generally available series but also include newly gathered material from periods covered by existing collections. The *Cases* will therefore form an important complementary series not only to such collections but also to the multi-volume *British Digest of International Law*, compiled from Foreign Office sources, publication of which has begun, by Stevens, under the auspices of the International Law Fund. Each volume of the *Cases* will contain a table giving the fullest possible references to the cases reported and an index.

The *British International Law Cases* and the *British Digest of International Law* have been prepared under the editorial direction of Dr. Clive Parry, of Downing College, Cambridge, and a distinguished team of lawyers. Volumes 1-3 are now published. These cover the important topics of States as International Persons, State Territory and Jurisdiction. Volumes 4 and 5 will appear in 1966. These will deal with Diplomatic and Consular Intercourse and Immunities, Nationality, Aliens, Extradition, Deportation, and the Law of Treaties.

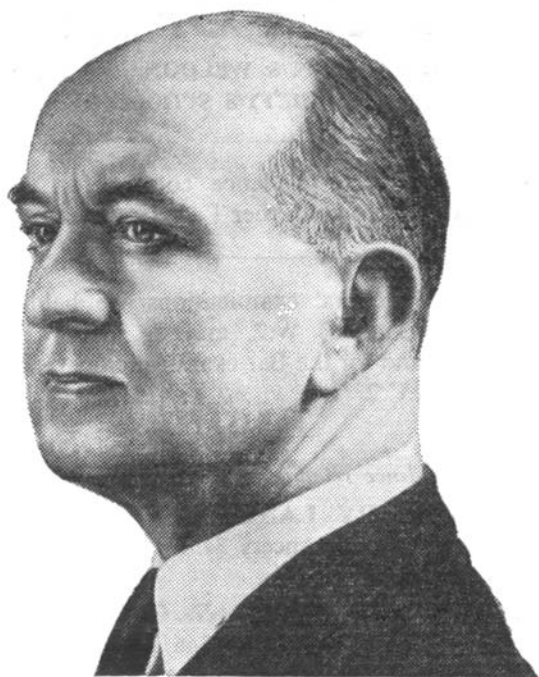
