In Vol. 53, No. 4, a typographical error appears in H. Martin Wobst's review of Clive Gamble's book, *The Paleolithic Settlement of Europe*. In the first paragraph on p. 664, the sentence "(This, of course, works only with high spatial autocorrelation!)" should read "(. . . low spatial autocorrelation!)"
