Candidates for Election as Ordinary Members should obtain a nomination form from the Secretary, Mineralogical Society, 41 Queen's Gate, London S.W. 7. Candidates must be proposed by two members of the Society, one, at least, of whom shall have personal knowledge of the candidate. There is an entrance fee of one pound (£1) and the annual subscription is three pounds, ten shillings (£3. 10s.); the latter can be compounded for by a single payment of sixty pounds (£60). New Members, on the payment of their first subscription, receive all the numbers of the Magazine and of Mineralogical Abstracts for the year for which the subscription is paid.

There are at least four meetings of the Society each year, on Thursdays, in January, March, June, and November.
