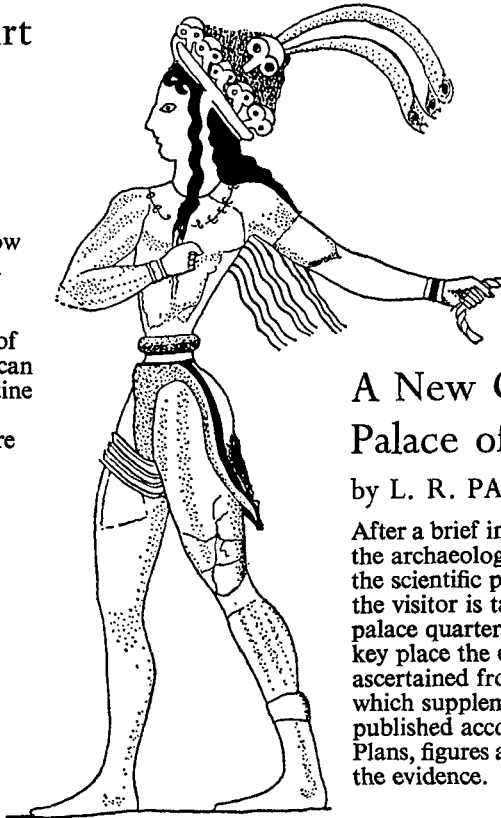

LANTERN SLIDES

The Slides Collection contains 3000 coloured slides (2" × 2") covering a wide variety of subjects, including sites on the Greek mainland, the Greek islands, Rome, Italy and the Roman Empire. Etruscan tomb paintings, Roman frescoes and mosaics, Greek vases, and objects from the Greek and Roman Life room of the British Museum are well represented. Coloured sets (2" × 2") are also available, with notes, on the Athenian Agora, Athens, Pompeii, Lerna, Greek Papyri, Greek Gods and Heroes, Sicily and Magna Graecia, Art in Roman Britain, Classical Costume and the Roman Army in Britain.
