- ▲ In the Thomson Reuters 2010 ▲  
Journal Citation Reports®,  
Cambridge journals saw an  
average increase in Impact Factor  
of almost 16.4%.
  
- ▲ Cambridge's Humanities and ▲  
Social Science journals increased  
by 23.7%, against a 0.1% average  
increase in the SSCI\*.
  
- ▲ Cambridge Science, Technology ▲  
and Medicine journals increased  
by 10.6% in comparison to a 1.8%  
average increase in the SCI\*.
