WAR AND CHRISTIANITY TODAY

by Franziskus K. Stratmann, O.P.

In candidly outlining and denouncing the frightful evils inherent in and associated with modern total war, Father Stratmann is, along with Pius XII and a number of Cardinals and Bishops, upholding the honour of the Church. Of greatest interest to most readers perhaps, will be Father Stratmann's penetrating analysis, from the moral viewpoint, of a possible war between East and West. He firmly rejects the notion of a 'preventive' war, but he denies with equal vigour that a Christian in the West can ignore or callously overlook the fate of millions under Russian domination. Other matters discussed include the Church's responsibility for peace, the question of conscientious objection, the personal duty of peace, and the U.N. There is also a very valuable commentary on Pius XII's Christmas address of 1948.

THE EDUCATION OF THE NOVICE

The essays in this volume represent some of the Papers read to about fifty Novice Mistresses at Spode House in Staffordshire in January, 1955. They try to deal with some of the problems which have arisen in recent years in Novitiates because of the changing circumstances of the outside world. It is the task of the novice mistress to act as a bridge between the life of the world and the life of the cloister and she has to educate the postulant and the novice into a new life, which is yet centuries old. 


