





The Prehistoric Antiquities of the Maltese Islands

J. D. EVANS

Dr Evans has attempted to bring together in one volume all the material currently available for reconstructing the prehistory of the Maltese islands. The body of the work is a survey consisting of detailed descriptions of all the sites and monuments, and of the excavation work that has been done on them, together with catalogues of the objects found in them. A bibliography is given for each site and its chronology is discussed. The many plans include new surveys of all the major monuments, and some plans of minor ones which have not been previously published. The material from them is illustrated with a large number of drawings and photographs. A long final section of the text traces the cultural development of the islands in the prehistoric period in the light of the total evidence, including that of the most recent excavations. The aim has been to produce a book which will serve at once as a work of reference and as a tool for the researcher.

THE BRITISH ACADEMY

CROMER GREEK PRIZE

WITH the view of maintaining and encouraging the study of Greek, particularly among the young, the first Earl of Cromer founded a Prize, to be administered by the British Academy, for the best Essay on any subject connected with the language, history, art, literature, or philosophy of Ancient Greece.

The next Prize, which is ordinarily a sum of £150, will be awarded in 1969 under the following Rules:—

1. The competition is open to all British subjects and citizens of Eire of either sex who will be under thirty-two years of age on 31 December 1968.

2. Any Essay which has already received or is in competition for another prize of the same nature will be inadmissible. A candidate to whom the Prize has been awarded will not be eligible to compete for it again. But an Essay which has not received the Prize may be submitted again (with or without alteration) in a future year so long as the writer remains eligible under Rule 1.

3. Consideration of the adjudicators shall be limited to work submitted to them,

whether published or unpublished, not exceeding 20,000 words in length.

4. Essays must be sent in to the Secretary of the Academy on or before 31 December 1968. They must be typed or printed and should have a note attached stating the main sources of information used.
