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4. The ordinary forms of grammar should be observed, both in the text and in the mathematics, including the displayed formulae. In particular, please ensure that the punctuation carries through the mathematics in the proper manner. Eschew abbreviations such as "eqn", "etc.", "Thm", "w.r.t.". Spelling and use of hyphens should be consistent.

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(a) Latin italics are indicated by a single underline, thus: \underline{a} , \underline{A} . Such symbols need not be so indicated when they occur in displayed formulae, but should be underlined when they appear in the text if there is any possibility of ambiguity. Formal statements of lemmas and theorems are in italics, and should be so shown in the manuscript. See also 6 below.
