The *Review of Socialist Law* covers all areas of the legal systems in Eastern Europe, China, and other Socialist states. As the Soviet legal model has spread beyond Eastern Europe diversification has meant that the specifically Soviet flavour of many legal institutions has been lost or attenuated. What has usually remained is three elements of political life which have a decisive impact on the structure of the legal systems of the countries concerned: the paramount position of a single leading party, large-scale Marxist-inspired nationalization or socialization of the means of production, and rigid economic planning. The *Review* provides a scholarly study of legal systems characterized by these three elements.

Both the comparative lawyer and the lawyer whose international practice involves contacts with any socialist legal system will find this forum for the publication of articles on socialist law in the English language extremely valuable. It provides up-to-date information on new legal developments and gives general access to legal material otherwise difficult to locate. Specialists in the political, socialist, economic and historical aspects of the societies concerned will also find the *Review of Socialist Law* useful.
