In the past nationality has been treated mainly from the aspect of municipal law, or as a question of "private international law." The present work is the first complete examination of the subject from the point of view of "public international law."

Closely linked with nationality is lack of nationality, or statelessness. Recent international efforts for the regulation of the status of stateless persons and the elimination or reduction of statelessness are reviewed in this work.

This is probably the most comprehensive modern treatment of the law of nationality that has so far appeared in the English language.
