It is all too easy to drift along on a tide of emotional devotion, and precisely because our devotion is not disciplined by the rule of faith, to become stagnant in the sands of sentiment. It is precisely with this danger in mind that Father Ian Hislop wrote these articles for adult and educated Christians. They first appeared in Blackfriars during 1955 and the interest they aroused has encouraged their publication in a more permanent form.

#### The Sacraments: Signs of Life

Father Roguet follows his book Holy Mass with a treatment of the Sacraments. Having explained the nature of a Sacrament, he deals with the seven in turn, with a note on sacramental spirituality.
