The al-Qaeda Mole who Infiltrated the CIA

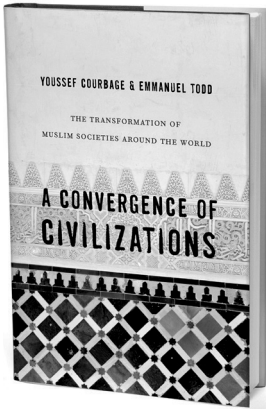
