
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ERRATA

The site locations on maps published in Hayden and Schulting's article "The Plateau Interaction Sphere and Late Prehistoric Cultural Complexity" (Vol. 62, No. 1, pp. 51–85) mistakenly place Neah Bay (site 100) on the Columbia River, whereas it should be located on the tip of the Olympic Peninsula; and Ksunku (site 103) is mislocated about 50 km downstream from its actual location in the vicinity of site 41.


