Fellowships in the Humanities and the Social Sciences

Senior scholars in the humanities and social sciences are invited to apply for a fellowship at the Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study (NIAS) in Wassenaar, located between the old university town of Leiden and The Hague, the Netherlands' seat of government. Successful applicants will be given the opportunity to devote themselves exclusively to their own academic projects, individually or as part of a research group.

Candidates must hold a doctorate and have a record of scholarly publication. NIAS Fellowships are residential fellowships and are granted only for a full research year, from **1 September - 30 June**. All fellowships are awarded on the recommendation of a Scholarship Committee, whose members are appointed by the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Fellows who come from universities outside the Netherlands will receive a stipend, the amount of which is individually determined. In addition to round-trip travel costs, free housing is offered to unaccompanied Fellows and housing at subsidised rates to Fellows who bring their families.

Scholars and researchers who wish to apply for a fellowship at NIAS can obtain an application form from the Institute. This must be submitted **18 months** before the opening date of the research year for which they wish to apply. Applicants will be asked to provide a résumé of their scholarly career and a description of the work they propose to carry out at NIAS.
