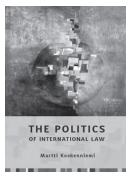

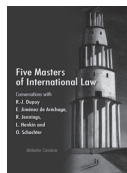
## The Politics of International Law

In his general introduction Cassese stresses that the interviews, all based on the same questionnaire, were intended to bring out not only the main ideas associated with each scholar in the fields of international law and international relations, but also his intellectual and philosophical background, his general outlook and his views of the prospects for the evolution of the international community.

**Antonio Cassese** is an international lawyer who has combined a career as a university professor with membership of important UN bodies, and, latterly, membership of several international tribunals.

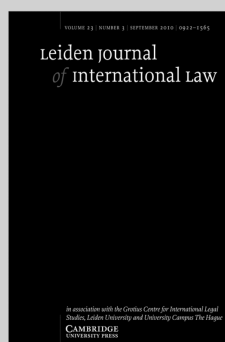
