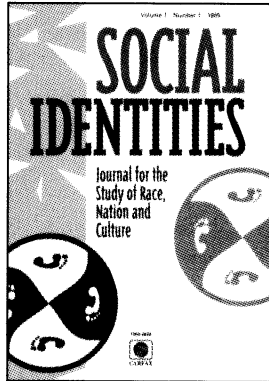

Recent years have witnessed considerable worldwide changes concerning social identities such as race, nation and ethnicity, as well as the emergence of new forms of racism and nationalism as discriminatory exclusions.

Focussing on these changes is a new body of academic work appearing in a wide range of journals. The aim of *Social Identities* is to furnish an interdisciplinary and international focal point for theorizing issues at the interface of social identities. The journal is especially concerned to address these issues in the context of the transforming political economies and cultures of postmodern and postcolonial conditions.

Social Identities is intended as a forum for contesting ideas and debates concerning the formations of, and transformations in, socially significant identities, their attendant forms of material exclusion and power, as well as the political and cultural possibilities opened up by these identifications.

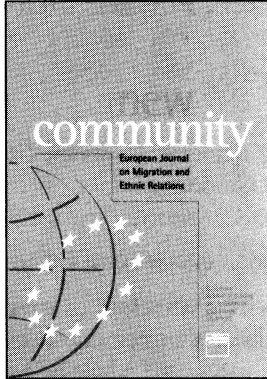

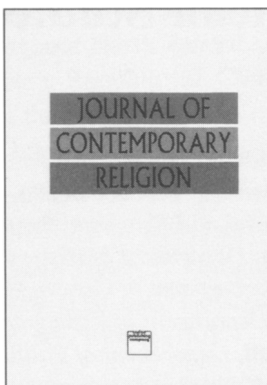

In 1995, *Religion Today* is to be relaunched as the **Journal of Contemporary Religion**.

Since its inception in 1984, *Religion Today* has provided a forum for discussion and analysis of new religions. A wide range of new movements

have been sampled, including Rastafarianism, Goddess worship, self-religions, the Unification Church ('Moonies'), Hare Krishna, the New Age Movement, New Japanese Religions and Rajneeshism. The philosophical, theological, educational and sociological aspects of these movements have been covered. Further, current developments in the major religions and, in recent times, the present situation of religion in Eastern Europe have been documented.

From 1995, the editorial coverage of the journal will be enhanced and expanded. While the focus will continue to be on new religions and new manifestations of religiosity and spirituality, there will be a place for articles covering trends and contemporary developments within mainstream churches and the world's major religions.

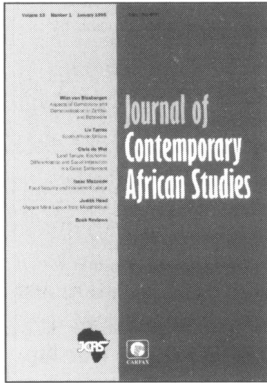
