# The Government and Administration of Germany

By
FREDERICK F. BLACHLY and MIRIAM E. OATMAN

THIS book is the first of a series of studies of the government and administration of the leading countries of Europe. Although the primary emphasis has been placed upon administration, the viewpoint has been taken that an administrative system can only be understood as considered in relation to the social and political philosophy behind it and the constitutional and legal structure within which it works and the way in which it is affected by political action. Especially is it desirable that the problem of administration shall be considered from the broad standpoint of the distribution of governmental functions between the central government and the political subdivisions.

The volume thus considers in a broad way the governmental system of Germany as a whole, the structural organization and functions of all its political units, the nation, the states, and the local units, the interrelation of these bodies from their operative standpoint, the methods of administration in general and of the more important special functions in particular, and the complicated lines of control over the many different political units and governmental agencies. Special emphasis has been laid upon the new system of taxation and its administration, the new budget system, the personnel system, the conduct or control of economic enterprises, the new educational system, and the system of administrative courts.

In addition to its appeal to the general reader, the volume should prove of especial value to the student of both comparative government and public administration, and for use in connection with courses on these subjects in the universities. For such use the volume has the added value that it has been prepared, after careful study in Germany, from original sources, constitutions, statutes, ordinances, etc., to which reference is in all cases made, and that it is provided with a large and carefully selected working bibliography.

Many of the other publications of the Institute for Government Research are likewise adapted for use in connection with university courses in public administration and comparative government. Among these special reference may be made to Principles of Public Administration, by W. F. Willoughby (1927), and The Development of National Administrative Organization in the United States, by L. M. Short (1923).
