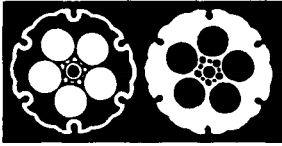

'Kokin Wakashū' and the Court Style in Japanese Classical Poetry

Helen Craig McCullough. This is the first full-scale study in English of *Kokin wakashū*—one of the world's earliest and most important poetic anthologies. Compiled in about 905 and consisting of over 1,000 poems, *Kokinshū* (as it is usually called) fixed the basic style of Japanese poetry and defined the aesthetics of an entire literary tradition. In her wide-ranging analysis, the author discusses the influence of Chinese poetry on Japanese writers, the characteristics of early Japanese composition in both Chinese and Japanese, the social and literary atmosphere out of which *Kokinshū* arose, the content and form of typical *Kokinshū* poems, the structure of the anthology, the question of individuality in a genre of convention, the role of the principal compiler in the shaping and transmission of the *Kokinshū* legacy, and related matters. \$60.00

Translated and Annotated by Helen Craig McCullough. Sparkling with wit and elegance, this new and complete translation of *Kokin wakashū* provides the Western reader fresh access to one of the enduring monuments of the unique culture of the Heian court. In addition to the poems in the basic text, Professor McCullough includes its Chinese and Japanese prefaces, the 11 so-called "deleted" poems, and the 29 poems that appear in one or another of the variant textual lines. Translations of two works by Ki no Tsurayuki, *Kokinshū*'s principal compiler, have been appended to facilitate the study of the *Kokinshū* style and Tsurayuki's poetics. \$40.00

The Riverside Counselor's Stories *Vernacular Fiction of Late Heian Japan*

Translated, with an Introduction and Notes, by Robert L. Backus. The 10 short narratives collected under the title *Tsutsumi Chuñagon monogatari* (The Riverside Counselor's Stories) are the only surviving examples of a Japanese literary tradition that flourished in the 11th and 12th centuries. The stories pursue the vicissitudes of amorous relations between aristocratic men and women, developing the action in realistic settings and giving close attention to the emotional state of the participants. They are important in two respects: they are enjoyable examples of the art of the short story, and they have a historical significance in showing us what late Heian vernacular fiction must have been like. Unlike earlier excessively literal renderings, these new translations attempt to convey the remarkably lively literary quality of the stories. \$35.00



Ōkubo Diary *Portrait of a Japanese Valley*

Brian Moeran. Part journal, part ethnographic observation and part social and moral commentary, *Ōkubo Diary* is a colorful and highly sensitive account of the intimate, day-to-day lives and the complex relationships of people living in a remote area of the Japanese countryside. Based on four years of fieldwork among the valley people, it describes the process by which a dedicated, compassionate anthropologist tries—and eventually fails—to “become at one with” his informants. Though the locale has been disguised and a few composite characters have been created, everything else related in the book actually happened. \$32.50

A COMPARATIVE DICTIONARY OF THE INDO-ARYAN LANGUAGES

ADDENDA AND CORRIGENDA

R. L. Turner, Edited by J. C. Wright

Sir Ralph Turner's *A Comparative Dictionary of the Indo-aryan Languages*, comprising some 140,000 words arranged under the 15,000 Sanskrit or Sanskrit-related etyma from which they appear to derive, was published by Oxford University Press in 1966. It was followed by *Indexes* (1969) and a *Phonetic Analysis* of the entire corpus of the material (1971). Described as 'one of the most outstanding events in the history of Indian linguistic studies', it took its place as a basis for all subsequent research beside Grierson's monumental *Linguistic Survey of India* (1903–27), of which it was long intended to form the concluding volume.

Subsequently Sir Ralph compiled a further 12,000 slips, noting and indexing new attestations and etymologies taken from works published since 1966. These provide additional data relating, for the most part, to Kacchī, West Pahāri, Gaṛhwālī, Assamese, Old Mārwarī, Brajbhāṣā, Maldivian, and the Shughni group of Iranian border languages, as well as Sanskrit. The scope of the Dictionary is thereby extended particularly in respect of the peripheral dialects, which have been less exposed to loss of inherited vocabulary due to the inroads of Persian, English and Sanskrit.

Sir Ralph died in 1983, in his 95th year. Until a few days before his death he was still engaged upon a final revision of this volume. It has been prepared for and seen through the press by Professor J. C. Wright, Professor of Sanskrit in the University of London.
