Mr. Bradford, who is University Demonstrator and Lecturer at the Pitt Rivers Museum, Oxford, has produced a major archaeological work which will undoubtedly be regarded as a pioneer contribution towards the study of the ways in which aerial photography has led to discoveries subsequently confirmed on the ground.

It is based on courses of University Lectures given at Oxford; many of the plates which illustrate the book are published here for the first time. The author's researches, for more than ten years past, have been carefully planned with the purpose of throwing new light on archaeological sites of many kinds, from Prehistoric, Classical and Medieval periods.

The subjects discussed include: the archaeology of such famous ancient cities as Paestum, Rhodes, Ostia, Carthage, Hatra (and many others); the mapping of 2,000 levelled Etruscan burial mounds; and the discovery of ancient field-systems in Greece, Italy, Dalmatia, Tunisia, France, etc.

NOVUM GLOSSARIUM MEDIÆ LATINITATIS

Sponsored by the Union Académique Internationale, this entirely new Dictionary of Medieval Latin, the result of some thirty-five years' work, has begun to appear. The fascicule containing the letter 'L', in 232 columns, is now ready, and the 'Index Scriptorum', 1,944 pp., at the subscription price of £2. 2s. 6d. and £4. 5s. respectively. Altogether the work will, it is estimated, take about 4,640 quarto pages. The rate of publication cannot for editorial reasons be accurately forecast, but it is intended to publish one or two fascicules yearly, the next being 'M' and 'N' (in 1958).
