The Hellenistic philosophers are not as well known to the general philosophical community as Plato and Aristotle, nor have they been studied by scholars with the intensity they deserve. Yet the achievement of Hellenistic philosophy was considerable in itself, and historically it had a formative influence on the development of modern philosophy. Heraclides of Pontus

H. D. Gottschalk

In this book Dr Gottschalk attempts to reconstruct the thought of Heraclides, a follower of Plato and older contemporary of Aristotle. After an introductory chapter on Heraclides' life and writings, five chapters deal with separate groups of fragments: the first offers a reconstruction of the dialogue *Peri tes apnou*; the rest deal with his corpuscular theory of matter, the astronomical fragments, ethical and religious fragments, and historical and literary studies. £12.50

Manilius

His Astronomica appears in English prose for the first time in a translation by Professor G.P.Goold of Yale University, the General Editor of the Loeb Classical Library. Abundant charts and star maps, introductory essays, and notes provide a guide to ancient astronomy and astrology, as well as to the text of the poem.

Libanius II

This is the second of three volumes of selections from one of the most prolific and influential writers of later antiquity. The book includes speeches from the period after Julian, translated by Professor A.F.Norman of the University of Hull. One of the sharpest critics of growing Christian intolerance, Libanius is a prime source of our knowledge of the society and attitudes of the fourth century.

Menander

Three volumes containing all of Menander are being edited and translated by W.G.Arnott, Professor of Greek, the University of Leeds. The first volume appeared in 1979. (These three volumes will replace the earlier one-volume edition.)

Greek Lyric

New discoveries, extensive scholarly work on the text, and a more accurate translation will be incorporated in a completely fresh version by Professor D.A.Campbell of the University of Victoria. The first volume will appear next year.

After tracing the changes in Thucydides' outlook against the background of events during the long composition of his masterpiece, the History, Sir Dennis deals fully with the main issues of Thucydidean scholarship, the stages of composition, the status of the speeches and the Melian Dialogue, the analysis of the causes of the war, Thucydides' political sympathies and reflections on revolution in the Greek cities. A. W. Johnston – TRADEMARKS ON GREEK VASES

The work embraces all those dipinti and graffiti found underneath decorated Greek vases over the period c.630 – c.360 B.C. The bulk of these marks are on Attic vases and Dr. Johnston presents these in a full catalogue raisonnée arranged by types of mark. There is an extensive commentary on the marks, lists of non-Attic vases and chapters on the origins, physical aspects, script, dialect and vocabulary of the marks, provenances of marked vases, vase names prices, painters, interpretations and trade. 304pp. A4; 53 photos, 14pp. figs; 0 85668 123 7; £24


