

Ahmed Emad Eldin is an award-winning digital artist, recognized globally for his work on Pink Floyd's "The Endless River" album cover and listed in Forbes 30 Under 30 in 2023. His artworks have been exhibited at prestigious venues worldwide, including the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Rome, and Sotheby's Gallery in London.

The artist writes: "When we're asked about our feelings and struggle to express them, it feels like a conflict within us. Different emotions compete to be expressed first, but there's no clear winner. Despite appearing calm, this inner struggle is ongoing, with the hope that "Happiness" eventually prevails."
